Notes:

1. The number of packs of Chinese medicine may vary depending on the adjustment of the medication fees and the maximum benefit limit.

2. Any charged amount, which is below the benefit limit, is not refundable.

3. The University will not provide any coverage for consultation / treatment relating to exclusion items. The scheme member concerned will need to pay the total expenses thus incurred. It is, however, not necessary for the member to pay the registration fee for treatment of exclusion items, nor will the visit for treatment of exclusion items be counted towards the annual limit.

4. The Standard Charges for consultations and other treatments will be based on the list posted in the clinics.

5. Once the annual quota has been exceeded, the scheme members will be charged walk-in rates at clinics. The Chinese Medicine Clinic, however, will give a discount of 30% on all basic consultation and treatment, except herbal medicine/granule, medications for external use, additional acupuncture or Tui Na, other treatments and herbal brewing.

6. The medication fees listed in the above table refer only to the costs of basic Chinese medicines. Expensive herbs and special medications are not included.

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
